

WINVaccs is the **Immunisation** module of the **Community Services Suite**. A powerful yet easy to use system which has been specifically developed to meet the needs of those responsible for delivering Immunisation services, designed to operate at an Immunisation session and/or on a fixed desktop Computer.

The Immunisation module of the Community Services Suite has been developed to cost effectively address the needs of immunisation providers such as Councils, hospitals, medical centres etc, and is the most widely used system of its type throughout Australia.

The Health Insurance Commission (HIC) has accredited Xpedite as a Licensed Supplier of Immunisation Software.

Major features at a glance:

- Efficient entry and storage of an extensive range of Infant/Child/Adult details. All immunisation sessions display personal history and recommended vaccines.
- The Session diary, an essential tool for management of sessions.
- Easy to use with coloured buttons and screens, graphical images, many user definable features, pull down menus and tick boxes mean less typing and more reporting. Almost all pull down lists and check boxes are Council maintainable.
- Efficiently manage the ordering and dispensing of vaccines by tracking stock orders, stock on hand, dispensing of stock and stock returns.
- Ability to record Reactions to vaccines.
- Record Vaccinations by GP or other Health Service (outside Council).
- Includes a responsive on-going maintenance program to reflect any changes in statutory requirements and the National Immunisation Program Schedule.
- Record Batch (multiple) immunisations.
